DATA ANALYSIS OF THE PALMETTO BUSINESS BAROMETER SURVEY

The Palmetto Business Barometer, a survey co-developed by DEW and the South Carolina Chamber of Commerce, asks our state's businesses to indicate their current and expected future business conditions. Topics measured include financial expectations, staffing concerns, remote work flexibility, and other indicators.


The survey is accessible on the South Carolina Chamber of Commerce website at https://tinyurl.com/PBBarometer, and is completely voluntary. Information gathered from the survey provides guidance for business community members as well as elected leaders. Consistent monthly participation in the survey from statewide businesses is encouraged to acquire accurate data and track workforce trends.

Survey Results

The survey was launched in January of this year, with 110 businesses participating that month and 160 in February. The amount of participation increased substantially in March with 595 total participants and again in April to 925.

Respondents were asked to give their business a performance rating on a scale of 1 (poor) to 10 (excellent). Participants rated their businesses' circumstances as moderately positive each month, with the average rating consistently between 7.2 and 7.6.



The top concerns participants expressed regarding their business for each month of the survey were inflation/price stability and adequate staffing levels, with most businesses rating both as a concern throughout.


When asked questions regarding changes in their business within the last month, most people said their revenue met expectations, their staffing levels were stable, and they did not seek capital to maintain or grow their business.


Additionally, over the past three months, most survey takers said all their workers were fully on-site with no remote or hybrid work.






Looking forward, most business owners and managers are interested in hiring more workers (55% in April). Increased training (35% in April) and wages (33% in April) were also common responses.






Around half of April participants believe their business conditions will remain the same in six months, 34 percent believe conditions will improve, and 15 percent believe conditions will decline. Subtracting the third figure from the second condenses the results into a single number, a business sentiment index of +19, reflecting a generally positive outlook among this set of South Carolina companies.

As has been widely reported, many businesses are having trouble find the workers they need. While most companies reported that they expect this to remain equally challenging six months from now (55 percent in April), many businesses believe it will be harder to find qualified workers in the near future (41 percent in April), with only 3 percent saying that hiring will get easier.

Since the Palmetto Business Barometer Survey is a new concept for gathering data from South Carolina businesses, DEW and the Chamber plan to investigate possibilities for increasing participation in future months to improve the quality and reliability of the data. Survey results will not only benefit South Carolina's businesses by providing invaluable relative information that will encourage growth, but legislators and other policymakers will also profit from the data by being able to recognize where businesses struggle and prosper.





SOUTH CAROLINA'S EMPLOYMENT SITUATION (MARCH 2023)

Household Survey¹ (Local Area Unemployment Statistics)

EMPLOYMENT: The seasonally adjusted, monthly survey of households estimated the number of South Carolinians working increased to 2,316,712.

- That is a significant increase of 10,648 people over the February 2023 estimate.
- That is an increase of 14,667 people over the March 2022 estimate.

UNEMPLOYMENT: The estimate of unemployed people increased to 76,435.

- That is an increase of 392 people from February's estimate and an increase of 266 from the March 2022 estimate.
- The state's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was unchanged at 3.2 percent.
- Nationally, the unemployment rate decreased from February's rate of 3.6 percent to 3.5 percent, according to the Current Population Survey.

LABOR FORCE: The state's estimated labor force (people working plus unemployed people looking for work) increased to 2,393,147.

- That is a significant increase of 11,040 people over the February estimate.
- That is an increase of 14,933 individuals over the March 2022 estimate.

Employer Survey² (Current Employment Statistics)

NONAGRICULTURAL EMPLOYMENT BY INDUSTRY (SEASONALLY ADJUSTED³)

The monthly survey of businesses in South Carolina marked an estimated increase of 4,200 nonfarm payroll jobs over the month to a level of 2,283,500.

- Industries that reported gains were Leisure and Hospitality (+1,400); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+1,200); Manufacturing (+900); Financial Activities (+700); Government (+500); Education and Health Services (+400); Information (+300); Other Services (+200); and Construction (+100).
- The Professional and Business Services industry (-1,500) declined.

From March 2022 to March 2023, South Carolina's economy has picked up 60,600 seasonally adjusted, nonfarm jobs.

 Industries with strong growth were Education and Health Services (+15,600); Leisure and Hospitality (+12,200); Government (+8,600); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+8,300); Professional and Business Services (+3,800); Financial Activities (+3,700); Manufacturing (+2,600); Information (+2,400); Other Services (+1,700); and Construction (+1,500).






NONAGRICULTURAL EMPLOYMENT BY INDUSTRY (NOT SEASONALLY ADJUSTED4)

Not seasonally adjusted, nonfarm payroll employment increased by 11,200 from February 2023 to March 2023 to make a total of 2,276,000.

- Leisure and Hospitality (+9,000); Trade,
 Transportation, and Utilities (+2,400); Government
 (+2,400); Manufacturing (+1,200); Information
 (+500); and Financial Activities (+400) industries
 increased over the month.
- Professional and Business Services (-4,200); Other Services (-300); and Education and Health Services (-200) industries marked declines.
- Mining and Logging and Construction industries showed no change over the month.

Since March 2022, not seasonally adjusted, nonfarm jobs were up 64,500 in South Carolina.


 Industries making strong annual gains were Educational and Health Services (+14,800); Leisure and Hospitality (+12,000); Government (+9,800); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+8,800); Professional and Business Services (+6,400); Financial Activities (+4,200); Information (+2,800); Construction (+2,500); Manufacturing (+2,000); Other Services (+1,000); and Mining and Logging (+200).

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




MONTHLY UNEMPLOYMENT SINCE JANUARY 2020




MONTHLY UNEMPLOYMENT RATE SINCE JANUARY 2020






MONTHLY LABOR FORCE PARTICIPATION RATE SINCE JANUARY 2020





TECHNICAL NOTES

- 1. **Household Survey:** Nationally, there is a monthly Current Population Survey of about 60,000 households conducted by the Census Bureau for the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) to determine employment status of the civilian population. This information, along with other inputs, are used by DEW to operate the Local Area Unemployment Statistics program, which estimates the number of individuals employed and those not employed, but actively seeking employment for statewide and a variety of sub-state geographies.
- 2. **Employer Survey:** BLS conducts a monthly Current Employment Statistics survey of about 44,000 employers which yields national estimates of nonagricultural wage and salary employment, hours, and earnings by industry. This data is processed by DEW to generate comparable data for the state and its metropolitan statistical areas.
- Seasonally Adjusted: Seasonal adjustment removes the
 effects of events that follow a regular pattern each year (i.e.
 tourist-related hiring and school closings in the summer).
 These adjustments make it easier to observe the cyclical and
 other nonseasonal movements in data over time.
- 4. **Not Seasonally Adjusted:** Effects of regular or seasonal patterns have not been removed from this data.
