South Carolina's Employment Situation April 2021

I. Household Survey¹

Employment: The seasonally adjusted, monthly survey of households estimated the number of South Carolinians working decreased to 2,263,256.

- That is a decrease of 4,186 people over the March 2021 estimate.
- That is a significant increase of 176,994 people over the April 2020 estimate.

Unemployment: Unemployment estimates decreased to 118,377 people.

- That is a decrease of 2,278 people from the March 2021 estimate and a notable decrease of 152,386 over the April 2020 estimate.
- The state's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased slightly to 5.0 percent in April from 5.1 percent in March.

Nationally, the unemployment rate increased to 6.1 percent in April from 6.0 percent in March.

Labor force: The state's estimated labor force (people working plus unemployed people looking for work) decreased to 2,381,633.

- That is a decrease of 6,464 people over the March 2021 estimate.
- That is an increase of 24,608 individuals over the April 2020 estimate.

Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted³)

The Current Employment Survey of businesses in South Carolina marked a decrease of 4,200 nonfarm payroll jobs over the month to a level of 2,113,300.

• Industries that reported gains were Education and Health Services (+2,300); Construction (+600); Government (+600); Other Services (+300); and Information (+100).

• Decreases were noticed in the Manufacturing (-2,500); Professional and Business Services (-2,300); Financial Activities (-1,300); Leisure and Hospitality (-1,300); and Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (-800).

From April 2020 to April 2021, South Carolina's economy has gained 224,700 seasonally adjusted, nonfarm jobs.

- Industries reporting growth were in Leisure and Hospitality (+85,600); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+41,300); Professional and Business Services (+29,100); Education and Health Services (+23,200); Manufacturing (+20,400); Other Services (+11,700); Construction (+7,200); Government (+3,400); Financial Activities (+1,900); and Information (+600).
- No industries reported decreases over the year.

Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Not Seasonally Adjusted²)

Not seasonally adjusted, nonfarm payroll employment increased by 7,500 from March 2021 to April 2021 for a total of 2,118,200.

- Increases were reported in Leisure and Hospitality (+5,600); Education and Health Services (+2,600); Construction (+1,800); Government (+1,200); Professional and Business Services (+900); Other Services (+800); and Mining and Logging (+100).
- Decreases were reported in Manufacturing (-3,500); Financial Activities (-1,700); and Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (-500) industries.

Since April 2020, not seasonally adjusted, nonfarm jobs were up 219,900 in South Carolina.

- Industries making strong annual gains are Leisure and Hospitality (+83,100); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+40,600); Professional and Business Services (+29,400); Education and Health Services (+23,700); Manufacturing (+19,300); Other Services (11,200); Construction (+7,900); Government (+3,400); Financial Activities (+500); Information (+500) and Mining and Logging (+300).
- No industries reported losses over the year.

¹Household Survey (Current Population Survey): is a monthly survey of about 60,000 households conducted by the Census Bureau for the Bureau of Labor Statistics. This survey provides monthly statistics on employment, unemployment, and related subjects analyzed by the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

²Current Employment Statistics Survey: is a monthly survey of about 40,000 employers which yields estimates of nonagricultural wage and salary employment, hours, and earnings by industry.

³Seasonally Adjusted: Seasonal adjustment removes the effects of events that follow a more or less regular pattern each year (i.e. tourist-related hiring and school closings in the summer). These adjustments make it easier to observe the cyclical and other nonseasonal movements in data over time.

⁴Not Seasonally Adjusted: Effects of regular or seasonal patterns have <u>not</u> been removed from these data.
