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# South Carolina's Employment Situation July 2021

#### I. Household Survey<sup>1</sup>

Employment: The seasonally adjusted, monthly survey of households estimated the number of South Carolinians working increased to 2,299,509.

- That is an increase of 10,217 people over the June 2021 estimate.
- That is a significant increase of 55,704 people over the July 2020 estimate.

Unemployment: Unemployment estimates decreased to 103,464 people.

- That is a decrease of 3,603 people from the June 2021 estimate and a substantial decrease of 80,006 over the July 2020 estimate.
- The state's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased to 4.3 percent in July from 4.5 percent in June.

Nationally, the unemployment rate decreased to 5.4 percent in July from 5.9 percent in June.

Labor force: The state's estimated labor force (people working plus unemployed people looking for work) increased to 2,402,973.

- That is an increase of 6,614 people over the June 2021 estimate.
- That is a decrease of 24,302 individuals over the July 2020 estimate.

#### Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted<sup>3</sup>)

The Current Employment Survey of businesses in South Carolina marked an increase of 20,100 nonfarm payroll jobs over the month to a level of 2,139,400.

- Industries that reported gains were in the Leisure and Hospitality (+9,300); Government (+5,100); Construction (+2,600); Manufacturing (+1,700); Professional and Business Services (+1,000); Financial Activities (+600); and Other Services (+400).
- Decreases were observed in the Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (-300); Information (-200); and Education and Health Services (-100) industries.

From July 2020 to July 2021, South Carolina's economy has picked up 98,000 seasonally adjusted, nonfarm jobs.

- Industries with strong growth were reported in the Leisure and Hospitality (+27,700); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+18,800); Government (+13,600); Manufacturing (+9,700); Education and Health Services (+9,500); Professional and Business Services (+8,100); Construction (+7,500); Other Services (+3,800); and Information (+700).
- There was a decline noticed in the Financial Activities (-1,500).

#### Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Not Seasonally Adjusted<sup>2</sup>)

Not seasonally adjusted, nonfarm payroll employment climbed by 2,200 from June 2021 to July 2021 for a total of 2,140,400.

- Increases were reported in Leisure and Hospitality (+9.400); Manufacturing (+3,500); Financial Activities (+700); Construction (+400); Other Services (+100) industries.
- Decreases were reported in the Government (-7,000); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (-2,500); and Education and Health Services (-2,400) industries.
- Mining and Logging; Professional and Business Services; and Information industries remained flat.

Since July 2020, not seasonally adjusted, nonfarm jobs were up 102,700 overall in South Carolina.

- Industries making strong annual gains are Leisure and Hospitality (+31,900); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+17,200); Government (+13,600); Manufacturing (+10,600); Professional and Business Services (+9,700); Education and Health Services (+9,100); Construction (+6,500); Other Services (+4,400); Information (+1,100); and Mining and Logging (+100).
- A decline was noticed in the Financial Activities (-1,500).

<sup>1</sup>Household Survey (Current Population Survey): is a monthly survey of about 60,000 households conducted by the Census Bureau for the Bureau of Labor Statistics. This survey provides monthly statistics on employment, unemployment, and related subjects analyzed by the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

<sup>2</sup>Current Employment Statistics Survey: is a monthly survey of about 40,000 employers which yields estimates of nonagricultural wage and salary employment, hours, and earnings by industry.

<sup>3</sup>Seasonally Adjusted: Seasonal adjustment removes the effects of events that follow a more or less regular pattern each year (i.e. tourist-related hiring and school closings in the summer). These adjustments make it easier to observe the cyclical and other nonseasonal movements in data over time.

<sup>4</sup>Not Seasonally Adjusted: Effects of regular or seasonal patterns have <u>not</u> been removed from these data.
