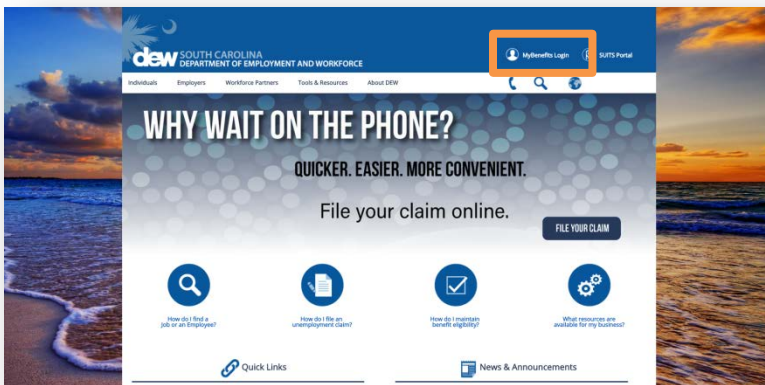


Your Employer May File Low Earnings or Partial Unemployment Claims on Behalf of You and Your Coworkers

Many employers file on behalf of their employees. Here are some important things you should know about employer filed claims.

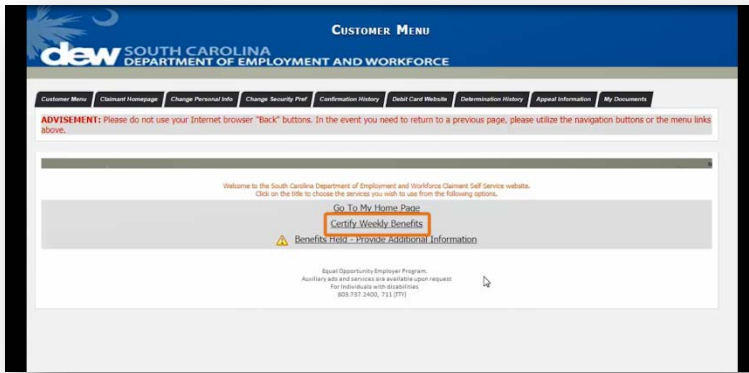
Employees, DO NOT file a new claim.

You will need to CERTIFY your weekly claims to receive unemployment benefits.

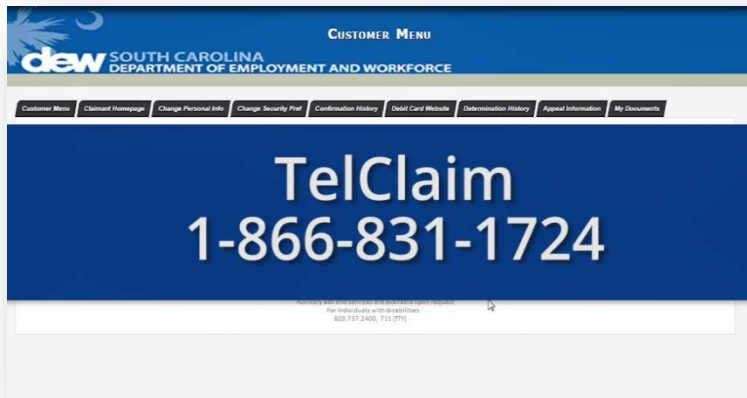


Visit dew.sc.gov to login or register in the MyBenefits portal.

If you have not already registered for an account, click the “Register Now” button. Once you have registered you will come back to the login screen to login with your new account information.



Once you have logged in, you will be directed to the customer menu page. In the middle, you should see a quick link that says "Certify Weekly Benefits." Click this link to complete the certification process.



If you do not see the quick link, call TelClaim at 1-866-831-1724 for assistance with your account.

Important Reminders

- You must certify each week that you receive payment.
- You must be able and available for work.
- Benefit weeks begin on Sunday and end on Saturday.
- You may not certify for the week until the employer has submitted the claim on your behalf. You have two weeks after your employer has submitted the claim to certify.
- You will not be paid the first week of the benefit year. This is considered the waiting week.
- When filing for benefits you must report any wages earned during that week including temporary or part-time.
