
YOUR EMPLOYER MAY FILE LOW EARNINGS OR PARTIAL UNEMPLOYMENT CLAIMS ON BEHALF OF YOU AND YOUR COWORKERS

Many employers file on behalf of their employees. Here are some important things you should know about employer filed claims:

- Employees can register online for a *MyBenefits* account to update personal information, change their payment method, or to view their payment status.
- Employees do not file a new claim while the employer is filing.
- Employees **do not** need to complete weekly certifications while the employer is filing.


IF YOU HAVE NOT ALREADY

IMPORTANT REMINDERS:

- You must be able and available for work.
- Benefit weeks begin on Sunday and end on Saturday.
- You will not be paid the first week of the benefit year. This is considered the waiting week.
- You must report your gross weekly earnings from ALL employment to the employer who is filing, and they must report those earnings to SCDEW.
 - Failure to report all earnings by you or your employer could result in an overpayment of benefits.
- If you receive a request for additional information from SCDEW, you must respond within the time allowed. Failure to respond timely could result in a delay or denial of benefits.
