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# South Carolina's Employment Situation February 2021

# I. Household Survey<sup>1</sup>

Employment: The seasonally adjusted, monthly survey of households estimated the number of South Carolinians working increased to 2,253,199.

- That is an increase of 17,896 people over the January 2021 estimate.
- That is also a decrease of 46,142 people over the February 2020 estimate.

Unemployment: Unemployment estimates decreased to 124,099 people.

- That is a decrease of 1,345 people from the January 2021 estimate and a notable increase of 58,119 over the February 2020 estimate.
- The state's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased slightly to 5.2 percent in February from 5.3 percent in January 2021.

Nationally, the unemployment rate declined modestly to 6.2 percent in February from 6.3 percent in January.

Labor force: The state's estimated labor force (people working plus unemployed people looking for work) increased to 2,377,298.

- That is a significant increase of 16,551 people over the January 2021 estimate.
- That is an increase of 11,997 individuals over the February 2020 estimate.

# Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted<sup>3</sup>)

The Current Employment Survey of businesses in South Carolina marked an increase of 6,300 nonfarm payroll jobs over the month to a level of 2,111,300.

• Industries that reported gains were noticed in the Transportation and Utilities (+6,200); Construction (+2,200); Professional and Business Services (+1,300); Manufacturing (+600); and Financial Activities (+200). • Decreases were noticed in the Leisure and Hospitality (-2,400); Government (-1,500) Information (-200); Education and Health (-100) industries. The Other Services industry remained flat.

From February 2020 to February 2021, South Carolina's economy has lost 85,100 seasonally adjusted, nonfarm jobs.

- Industry with strong growth was Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+3,700).
- Decreases were reported in Leisure and Hospitality (-37,700); Government (-16,900); Manufacturing (-10,400); Education and Health Services (-9,900); Other Services (-5,700); Professional and Business Services (-5,000); Construction (-1,300); Financial Activities (-1,200); and Information (-700) industries.

## Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Not Seasonally Adjusted<sup>2</sup>)

Not seasonally adjusted, nonfarm payroll employment increased by 18,200 from January 2021 to February 2021 for a total of 2,090,700.

- Increases were reported in Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+4,800); Construction (+3,600); Professional and Business Services (+3,200); Government (+2,200); Leisure and Hospitality (+1,900); Manufacturing (+1,300); Education and Health Services (+1,100) Financial Activities (+200); and Other Services (+200) Industry.
- A decrease was reported in the Information (-300) industry.
- Mining and Logging showed no movement over the period.

Since February 2020, not seasonally, adjusted nonfarm jobs were down 85,100 overall in South Carolina.

- Industries making strong annual gain were Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+3,900) and Construction (+100) industries.
- Industries recording an over-the-year loss are Leisure and Hospitality (-38,800); Government (-16,400); Education and Health Services (-11,800); Manufacturing (-10,100); Other Services (-5,900); Professional and Business Services (-4,100); Financial Activities (-1,200); and Information (-800).
- Mining and Logging showed no over the year change.

<sup>1</sup>Household Survey (Current Population Survey): is a monthly survey of about 60,000 households conducted by the Census Bureau for the Bureau of Labor Statistics. This survey provides monthly statistics on employment, unemployment, and related subjects analyzed by the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

<sup>2</sup>Current Employment Statistics Survey: is a monthly survey of about 40,000 employers which yields estimates of nonagricultural wage and salary employment, hours, and earnings by industry.

<sup>3</sup>Seasonally Adjusted: Seasonal adjustment removes the effects of events that follow a more or less regular pattern each year (i.e. tourist-related hiring and school closings in the summer). These adjustments make it easier to observe the cyclical and other nonseasonal movements in data over time.

<sup>4</sup>Not Seasonally Adjusted: Effects of regular or seasonal patterns have <u>not</u> been removed from these data.
