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# South Carolina's Employment Situation January 2021

## I. Household Survey<sup>1</sup>

Employment: The seasonally adjusted, monthly survey of households estimated the number of South Carolinians working increased to 2,235,303.

- That is an increase of 11,823 people over the December 2020 revised estimate.
- That is also a significant decrease of 68,881 people over the January 2020 revised estimate.

Unemployment: Unemployment estimates decreased to 125,683 people.

- That is a decrease of 5,899 people from the revised December 2020 estimate and a notable increase of 63,545 over the January 2020 revised estimate.
- The state's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased to 5.3 percent in January from the revised rate of 5.6 percent in December 2020.

Nationally, the unemployment rate declined to 6.3 percent in January from 6.7 percent in December.

Labor force: The state's estimated labor force (people working plus unemployed people looking for work) increased to 2,360,986.

- That is an increase of 5,924 people over the revised estimate in December 2020.
- That is a decrease of 5,336 individuals over the January 2020 revised estimate.

### Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted<sup>3</sup>)

The Current Employment Survey of businesses in South Carolina marked a decrease of 12,900 nonfarm payroll jobs over the month to a level of 2,104,400.

• Industries reporting gains were noticed in the Other Services (+400); Trade, Transportation and Utilities (+300); Education and Health Services (+300); and Information (+100)

• Decreases were noticed in the Leisure and Hospitality (-3,800); Construction (-3,200); Government (-3,200); Professional and Business Services (-2,100); Manufacturing (-1,000); and Financial Activities (-700) industries.

From January 2020 to January 2021, South Carolina's economy has lost 94,300 seasonally adjusted nonfarm jobs.

- No industries reported gains over the year.
- Decreases were reported in Leisure and Hospitality (-35,700); Government (-14,500); Manufacturing (-10,900); Education and Health Services (-9,000); Professional and Business Services (-9,000); Other Services (-5,900); Construction (-4,400); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (-2,600); Financial Activities (-1,300); and Information (-1,000) industries.

### Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Not Seasonally Adjusted<sup>2</sup>)

Not seasonally adjusted, nonfarm payroll employment decreased by 55,200 from December 2020 to January 2021 for a total of 2,074,400.

- No industries reported gains over the year.
- Decreases were reported in Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (-12,100); Leisure and Hospitality (-11,800); Professional and Business Services (-9,500); Government (-9,500); Construction (-5,000); Education and Health Services (-3,100); Manufacturing (-2,400); Financial Activities (-1,400); Other Services (-200); and Information (-200).
- Mining and Logging showed no movement over the period.

Since January 2020, not seasonally adjusted nonfarm jobs were down 93,400 overall in South Carolina.

- No industries reported a gain.
- Industries recording an over-the-year loss are Leisure and Hospitality (-36,900); Government (-15,300); Manufacturing (-10,800); Education and Health Services (-10,000); Professional and Business Services (-7,600); Other Services (-6,100); Construction (-3,800); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (-1,200); and Financial Activities (-900); and Information (-800) industries.
- Mining and Logging showed no over the year change.

<sup>1</sup>Household Survey (Current Population Survey): is a monthly survey of about 60,000 households conducted by the Census Bureau for the Bureau of Labor Statistics. This survey provides monthly statistics on employment, unemployment, and related subjects analyzed by the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

<sup>2</sup>Current Employment Statistics Survey: is a monthly survey of about 40,000 employers which yields estimates of nonagricultural wage and salary employment, hours, and earnings by industry.

<sup>3</sup>Seasonally Adjusted: Seasonal adjustment removes the effects of events that follow a more or less regular pattern each year (i.e. tourist-related hiring and school closings in the summer). These adjustments make it easier to observe the cyclical and other nonseasonal movements in data over time.

<sup>4</sup>Not Seasonally Adjusted: Effects of regular or seasonal patterns have <u>not</u> been removed from these data.
