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# South Carolina's Employment Situation June 2021

## I. Household Survey<sup>1</sup>

Employment: The seasonally adjusted, monthly survey of households estimated the number of South Carolinians working increased significantly to 2,289,714.

- That is a notable increase of 12,209 people over the May 2021 estimate.
- That is a significant increase of 80,654 people over the June 2020 estimate.

Unemployment: Unemployment estimates decreased to 107,035 people.

- That is a decrease of 3,402 people from the May 2021 estimate and a substantial decrease of 76,827 over the June 2020 estimate.
- The state's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased to 4.5 percent in June from 4.6 percent in May.

Nationally, the unemployment rate increased to 5.9 percent in June from 5.8 percent in May.

Labor force: The state's estimated labor force (people working plus unemployed people looking for work) increased to 2,396,749.

- That is an increase of 8,807 people over the May 2021 estimate.
- That is an increase of 3,827 individuals over the June 2020 estimate.

## Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted<sup>3</sup>)

The Current Employment Survey of businesses in South Carolina marked an increase of 6,300 nonfarm payroll jobs over the month to a level of 2,118,800.

• Industries reporting gains were Education and Health Services (+1,800); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+1,800); Manufacturing (+1,000); Other Services (+1,000); Professional and Business Services (+800); Construction (+400); and Government (+400).

- Decreases were observed in the Financial Activities (-600) and Leisure and Hospitality (-400) industries.
- Information remained flat.

From June 2020 to June 2021, South Carolina's economy has picked up 95,900 seasonally adjusted, nonfarm jobs.

- Industries with strong growth were reported in the Leisure and Hospitality (+26,000); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+21,800); Education and Health Services (+13,000); Professional and Business Services (+13,000); Government (+8,700); Manufacturing (+6,800); Construction (+4,900); Other Services (+2,200); and Information (+1,000).
- Financial Activities jobs declined (-1,600).

### Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Not Seasonally Adjusted<sup>2</sup>)

Not seasonally adjusted, nonfarm payroll employment climbed by 15,200 from May 2021 to June 2021 for a total of 2,137,300.

- Increases were reported in Leisure and Hospitality (+9,000); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+5,800); Construction (+1,400); Manufacturing (+1,400); Other Services (+1,300); Professional and Business Services (+1,100); Financial Activities (+700); Information (+200); and Mining and Logging (+100) industries.
- Decreases were reported in the Government (-5,400) and Education and Health Services (-400) industries.

Since June 2020, not seasonally adjusted, nonfarm jobs were up 98,500 overall in South Carolina.

- Industries making strong annual gains were Leisure and Hospitality (+28,700); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+22,300); Professional and Business Services (+14,500); Education and Health Services (+13,200); Government (+7,000); Manufacturing (+5,500); Construction (+5,400); Other Services (+2,300); Information (+1,200); and Mining and Logging (+100).
- Financial Activities jobs declined (-1,700).

<sup>1</sup>Household Survey (Current Population Survey): is a monthly survey of about 60,000 households conducted by the Census Bureau for the Bureau of Labor Statistics. This survey provides monthly statistics on employment, unemployment, and related subjects analyzed by the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

<sup>2</sup>Current Employment Statistics Survey: is a monthly survey of about 40,000 employers which yields estimates of nonagricultural wage and salary employment, hours, and earnings by industry.

<sup>3</sup>Seasonally Adjusted: Seasonal adjustment removes the effects of events that follow a more or less regular pattern each year (i.e. tourist-related hiring and school closings in the summer). These adjustments make it easier to observe the cyclical and other nonseasonal movements in data over time.

<sup>4</sup>Not Seasonally Adjusted: Effects of regular or seasonal patterns have <u>not</u> been removed from these data.
