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South Carolina's Employment Situation May 2021

I. Household Survey¹

Employment: The seasonally adjusted, monthly survey of households estimated the number of South Carolinians working increased significantly to 2,277,749.

- That is a substantial increase of 14,783 people over the April 2021 estimate.
- That is a significant increase of 185,178 people over the May 2020 estimate.

Unemployment: Unemployment estimates decreased significantly to 110,339 people.

- That is a decrease of 8,056 people from the April 2021 estimate and a notable decrease of 162,825 over the May 2020 estimate.
- The state's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased appreciably to 4.6 percent in May from 5.0 percent in April.

Nationally, the unemployment rate decreased to 5.8 percent in May from 6.1 percent in April.

Labor force: The state's estimated labor force (people working plus unemployed people looking for work) increased to 2,388,088.

- That is an increase of 6,727 people over the April 2021 estimate.
- That is an increase of 22,353 individuals over the May 2020 estimate.

Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted³)

The Current Employment Survey of businesses in South Carolina marked an increase of 4,100 nonfarm payroll jobs over the month to a level of 2,115,700.

- Industries reporting gains were Leisure and Hospitality (+4,000); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+2,600); Manufacturing (+900); Information (+700); Education and Health Services (+500); and Other Services (+200).
- Decreases were observed in the Government (-2,500); Financial Activities (-1,100); and Construction (-1,000) industries.

From May 2020 to May 2021, South Carolina's economy has picked up 158,600 seasonally adjusted, nonfarm jobs.

- Industries with strong growth were reported in the Leisure and Hospitality (+55,000); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+31,400); Professional and Business Services (+20,700); Manufacturing (+17,100); Education and Health Services (+16,500); Other Services (+6,900); Construction (+5,800); Government (+4,300); and Information (+1,100).
- A decline was noticed in the Financial Activities (-200) industry.

Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Not Seasonally Adjusted²)

Not seasonally adjusted, nonfarm payroll employment climbed by 10,400 from April 2021 to May 2021 for a total of 2,126,000.

- Increases were reported in Leisure and Hospitality (+9,200); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+4,500); Manufacturing (+1,400); Other Services (+1,100); Education and Health Services (+800) and Information (+600) industries.
- Decreases were reported in the Government (-4,800); Professional and Business Services (-1,000); and Construction (-600) industries.
- Mining and Logging showed no change.

Since May 2020, not seasonally, adjusted nonfarm jobs were up 154,900 in South Carolina.

- Industries making strong annual gains were Leisure and Hospitality (+52,800); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+30,300); Professional and Business Services (+21,400); Education and Health Services (+17,100); Manufacturing (+16,700); Other Services (7,000); Construction (+5,900); Government (+3,600); and Information (+1,000).
- A decline was noticed in the Financial Activities (-900) industry.
- Mining and Logging remained flat over the year.

¹Household Survey (Current Population Survey): is a monthly survey of about 60,000 households conducted by the Census Bureau for the Bureau of Labor Statistics. This survey provides monthly statistics on employment, unemployment, and related subjects analyzed by the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

²Current Employment Statistics Survey: is a monthly survey of about 40,000 employers which yields estimates of nonagricultural wage and salary employment, hours, and earnings by industry.

³Seasonally Adjusted: Seasonal adjustment removes the effects of events that follow a more or less regular pattern each year (i.e. tourist-related hiring and school closings in the summer). These adjustments make it easier to observe the cyclical and other nonseasonal movements in data over time.

⁴Not Seasonally Adjusted: Effects of regular or seasonal patterns have <u>not</u> been removed from these data.
