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South Carolina's Employment Situation August 2021

I. Household Survey¹

Employment: The seasonally adjusted, monthly survey of households estimated the number of South Carolinians working increased to 2,302,743.

- That is an increase of 3,394 people over the July 2021 estimate.
- That is an increase of 30,729 people over the August 2020 estimate.

Unemployment: Unemployment estimates decreased to 101,527 people.

- That is a decrease of 1,927 people from the July 2021 estimate and a substantial decrease of 29,022 over the August 2020 estimate.
- The state's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased to 4.2 percent in August from 4.3 percent in July.

Nationally, the unemployment rate decreased to 5.2 percent in August from 5.4 percent in July.

Labor force: The state's estimated labor force (people working plus unemployed people looking for work) increased to 2,404,270.

- That is an increase of 1,467 people over the July 2021 estimate.
- That is an increase of 1,707 individuals over the August 2020 estimate.

Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted³)

The Current Employment Survey² of businesses in South Carolina marked an increase of 3,100 nonfarm payroll jobs over the month to a level of 2,137,800.

• Industries that reported gains were Government (+5,900); Leisure and Hospitality (+2,500); Construction (+500); Professional and Business Services (+500); Information (+400); and Manufacturing (+200).

- Decreases were observed in the Education and Health Services (-5,300); Other Services (-1,300); and Financial Activities (-200).
- Trade, Transportation, and Utilities remained flat.

From August 2020 to August 2021, South Carolina's economy has picked up 68,500 seasonally adjusted, nonfarm jobs.

- Industries with strong growth were reported in the Leisure and Hospitality (+26,500); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+14,400); Construction (+7,900); Manufacturing (+7,200); Education and Health Services (+4,600); Government (+4,500); Professional and Business Service (+3,400); Other Services (+1,800) and Information (+1,000).
- Declines were observed in Financial Activities (-2,800).

Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Not Seasonally Adjusted⁴)

Not seasonally adjusted, nonfarm payroll employment increased by 600 from July 2021 to August 2021 for a total of 2,138,300.

- Increases were reported in Government (+8,900); Construction (+700); and Information (+100) industries.
- Decreases were reported in Leisure and Hospitality (-3,200); Other Services (-1,600); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (-1,600); Education and Health Services (-900); Manufacturing (-600); Professional and Business Services (-600); Financial Activities (-500); and Mining and Logging (-100) industries.

Since August 2020, not seasonally adjusted, nonfarm jobs were up 67,300, overall, in South Carolina.

- Industries making strong annual gains were Leisure and Hospitality (+28,500); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+13,500); Manufacturing (+7,400); Construction (+6,800); Education and Health Services (+5,800); Government (+3,000); Other Services (+2,200); Professional and Business Services (+2,200); and Information (+1,100).
- Declines were noticed in Financial Activities (-3,200).

¹Household Survey (Current Population Survey): is a monthly survey of about 60,000 households conducted by the Census Bureau for the Bureau of Labor Statistics. This survey provides monthly statistics on employment, unemployment, and related subjects analyzed by the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

²Current Employment Statistics Survey: is a monthly survey of about 40,000 employers which yields estimates of nonagricultural wage and salary employment, hours, and earnings by industry.

³Seasonally Adjusted: Seasonal adjustment removes the effects of events that follow a more or less regular pattern each year (i.e. tourist-related hiring and school closings in the summer). These adjustments make it easier to observe the cyclical and other nonseasonal movements in data over time.

⁴Not Seasonally Adjusted: Effects of regular or seasonal patterns have <u>not</u> been removed from these data.
