South Carolina's Employment Situation January 2023

I. Household Survey¹ (Local Area Unemployment Statistics)

Employment: The seasonally adjusted, monthly survey of households estimated the number of South Carolinians working increased to 2,298,720.

- That is an increase of 4,329 people over the December 2022 estimate.
- That is an increase of 10,471 people over the January 2022 estimate.

Unemployment: The estimate of unemployed people decreased to 76,070.

- That is a decrease of 1,089 people from December's estimate and a decrease of 2,352 from the January 2022 estimate.
- The state's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate declined from 3.3 percent in December to 3.2 percent in January.
- Nationally, the unemployment rate declined from December's rate of 3.5 percent to 3.4 percent, according to the Current Population Survey.

Labor force: The state's estimated labor force (people working plus unemployed people looking for work) increased to 2,374,790.

- That is an increase of 3,240 people over the December 2022 estimate.
- That is an increase of 8,119 individuals over the January 2022 estimate.

II. Employer Survey² (Current Employment Statistics)

Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted³)

The monthly survey of businesses in South Carolina marked an estimated increase of 8,900 nonfarm payroll jobs over the month to a level of 2,272,600.

- Industries that reported gains were Education and Health Services (+3,300); Leisure and Hospitality (+2,700); Government (+2,600); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+1,900); Construction (+300); and Information (+100).
- Financial Activities (-1,200); Other Services (-400); Professional and Business Services (-200); and Manufacturing (-200) industries declined.

From January 2022 to January 2023, South Carolina's economy has picked up 72,100 seasonally adjusted, nonfarm jobs.

• Industries with strong growth were Education and Health Services (+15,400); Leisure and Hospitality (+12,600); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+12,500); Government (+11,300); Manufacturing (+6,100); Financial Activities (+3,700); Professional and Business Services (+3,000); Construction (+2,900); Other Services (+2,400); and Information (+2,100).

Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Not Seasonally Adjusted⁴)

Not seasonally adjusted, nonfarm payroll employment decreased by 35,200 from December 2022 to January 2023 for a total of 2,240,300.

- Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (-10,100); Professional and Business Services (-7,900); Leisure and Hospitality (-5,700); Government (-5,600); Manufacturing (-2,400); Financial Activities (-1,500); Education and Health Services (-1,100); Construction (-300); and Other Services (-200) marked declines.
- The Mining and Logging industry showed no change over the month.

Since January 2022, not seasonally adjusted, nonfarm jobs were up 66,000 in South Carolina.

- Industries making strong annual gains were Educational and Health Services (+14,200); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+13,400); Leisure and Hospitality (+10,600); Government (+8,900); Manufacturing (+6,500); Financial Activities (+4,400); Construction (+3,800); Other Services (+2,600); Information (+2,200); and Mining and Logging (+200).
- The Professional and Business Services (-800) industry showed a decline over the year.

¹Household Survey: Nationally, there is a monthly Current Population Survey of about 60,000 households conducted by the Census Bureau for the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) to determine employment status of the civilian population. This information, along with other inputs, are used by DEW to operate the Local Area Unemployment Statistics program, which estimates the number of individuals employed and those not employed, but actively seeking employment for statewide and a variety of substate geographies.

Employer Survey: BLS conducts a monthly Current Employment Statistics survey of about 44,000 employers which yields national estimates of nonagricultural wage and salary employment, hours, and earnings by industry. These data are processed by DEW to generate comparable data for the state and its metropolitan statistical areas.

³Seasonally Adjusted: Seasonal adjustment removes the effects of events that follow a regular pattern each year (i.e. tourist-related hiring and school closings in the summer). These adjustments make it easier to observe the cyclical and other nonseasonal movements in data over time.

⁴Not Seasonally Adjusted: Effects of regular or seasonal patterns have <u>not</u> been removed from these data.
