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South Carolina's Employment Situation October 2021

I. Household Survey¹

Employment: The seasonally adjusted, monthly survey of households estimated the number of South Carolinians working increased to 2,313,476.

- That is an increase of 4,156 people over the September 2021 estimate.
- That is an increase of 7,218 people over the October 2020 estimate.

Unemployment: Unemployment estimates decreased to 94,322 people.

- That is a significant decrease of 4,738 people from the September 2021 estimate and a significant decrease of 36,535 over the October 2020 estimate.
- The state's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased significantly to 3.9 percent in October from 4.1 percent in September.

Nationally, the unemployment rate decreased to 4.6 percent in October from 4.8 percent in September.

Labor force: The state's estimated labor force (people working plus unemployed people looking for work) was little changed over the month, decreasing to 2,407,798.

- That is a decrease of 582 people over the September 2021 estimate.
- That is a decrease of 29,317 individuals over the October 2020 estimate.

Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted³)

The Current Employment Survey² of businesses in South Carolina marked an increase of 6,700 nonfarm payroll jobs over the month to a level of 2,157,500.

- Industries reporting gains were Manufacturing (+4,200); Professional and Business Services (+2,000); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+1,500); Other Services (+800); Financial Activities (+500); Education and Health Services (+200); and Information (+100).
- Decreases were observed in the Construction (-1,900); Government (-600); and Leisure and Hospitality (-100) industries.

From October 2020 to October 2021, South Carolina's economy has picked up 65,500 seasonally adjusted, nonfarm jobs.

- Industries with strong growth were reported in Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+19,600); Leisure and Hospitality (+17,600); Manufacturing (+7,400); Education and Health Services (6,300); Construction (5,100); Other Services (+5,000); Government (+4,000); Professional and Business Services (+1,100); and Information (+700).
- There was a decline in the Financial Activities (-1,400) industry.

Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Not Seasonally Adjusted⁴)

Not seasonally adjusted, nonfarm payroll employment climbed 17,900 from September 2021 to October 2021 for a total of 2,165,500.

- Increases were reported in Professional and Business Services (+5,400); Manufacturing (+3,500); Government (3,200); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+2,900); Educational and Health Services (+2,800); Financial Activities (+1,400); Other Services (+900); Information (+200); and Mining and Logging (+100) industries.
- Decreases were reported in the Leisure and Hospitality (-1,400); and Construction (-1,100) industries.

Since October 2020, not seasonally adjusted, nonfarm jobs increased 70,100 in South Carolina.

- Industries making strong annual gains were Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+21,200); Leisure and Hospitality (+20,800); Manufacturing (+8,300), Other Services (+5,700); Education and Health Services (+5,400); Construction (+4,300); Government (+4,300); Information (+800); and Mining and Logging (+100).
- Declines were noticed in the Financial Activities (-500) and Professional and Business Services (-300) industries.

¹Household Survey (Current Population Survey): is a monthly survey of about 60,000 households conducted by the Census Bureau for the Bureau of Labor Statistics. This survey provides monthly statistics on employment, unemployment, and related subjects analyzed by the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

²Current Employment Statistics Survey: is a monthly survey of about 40,000 employers which yields estimates of nonagricultural wage and salary employment, hours, and earnings by industry.

³Seasonally Adjusted: Seasonal adjustment removes the effects of events that follow a more or less regular pattern each year (i.e. tourist-related hiring and school closings in the summer). These adjustments make it easier to observe the cyclical and other nonseasonal movements in data over time.

⁴Not Seasonally Adjusted: Effects of regular or seasonal patterns have <u>not</u> been removed from these data.
